
The Later Life Audio and Radio Network


This poster outlines our process of using participatory action research, a collaborative and democratic method of researching together with local communities [1].

Research questions on using audio/radio to promote civic participation in later life [2,3]

Can we **promote positive views** & challenge negative stereotypes on age and ageing by providing talk-based audio/radio content created by diverse groups of older adults?

How can we strengthen the visibility of content created by older adults in media & encourage the expansion of radio programming related to ageing and intergenerational relationships?

In what ways can older adults engage in broadcasting & how can **skill development** be facilitated?



Arlind & Mervyn record an episode of Age Speaks at East London Radio. We discuss **creating a radio network**, which promotes the work of older radio producers and involvement of older adults in civic life (on- & offline).



July 2019:

We meet Sonder Radio (Manchester) at Open Lab to talk about radio as a tool for engaging cross-generational **communities** with technology & content creation. Sonder join the Radio Network.



"The Later Life Audio and Radio Network" (LLARN). We take first steps to become a co-operative.


February 2018:

We start the research collaboration between Arlind at Open Lab and the Older Voices radio team of the Elders Council of Newcastle looking at radio production in relation to digital & civic participation.



October 2019:

We host a 2-day participatory Radio Festival for older adults with discussions about civic activism through radio, technical production workshops and live broadcasts. The Network is born.




February 2020: Our first tweet!

From March 2020:

We create a mixcloud page (LLARNetwork) to showcase diverse contributions of older adults in broadcasting and in civic debates. Shifting to remote digital production, the LLARN members record discussions about later life & COVID-19 responding to ageist policies and narratives in mainstream media.
